

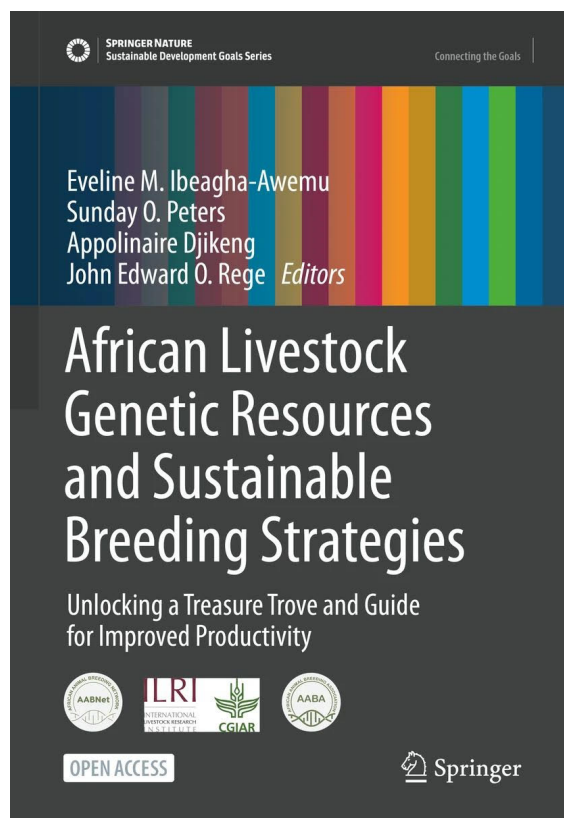

Background and Purpose

The African Animal Breeding Network (AABNet) brings together animal breeders, geneticists, and livestock professionals committed to advancing resilient, sustainable, and profitable livestock systems in Africa. Central to this mission is the recognition, conservation, and sustainable utilization of Africa's rich animal genetic resources (AnGR).

The book African Livestock Genetic Resources and Sustainable Breeding Strategies: Unlocking a Treasure Trove and Guide for Improved Productivity represents a landmark, Africa-led scholarly effort to consolidate knowledge on the characterization, conservation, and use of African livestock genetic resources. Developed by African scientists and partners and published as an open-access resource with support from the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI), the book is intended to serve National Agricultural Research and Extension Systems (NARES), policymakers, researchers, students, development practitioners, and livestock producers across the continent.

The objective of this one-day event is to launch the book officially, showcase its key themes, honor outstanding contributions to animal genetic resources in Africa, and stimulate dialogue on strategies to improve livestock productivity through sustainable breeding and genetic innovations.
